4. ESH AND ESH FOUNDATION FINANCES

a. Report on Meeting with Ornitag

M. Burnier gave a brief summary of the Finances Meeting held on March 1, 2019 with the representative, R. Schildknecht. of ORNITAG. It was a first face to face meeting as neither ESH nor the ORNITAG representatives had ever meet personally. R. Schildknecht gave a short introduction of himself and on the legal support, and all the administrative and financial management aspects carried out by ORNITAG for both ESH and FESH.

b. Future Perspectives

Currently, most of ESH/FESH assets are liquid. Currently, cash assets are the lowest-risk investments available, therefore the decision to sell 95% of the assets. Only a small amount of security's were retained. Due to the favorable exchange, liquid assets were changed from CHF to Euro.

FESH legal offices are in Switzerland, and as a foundation is exempt from taxes. To pay less taxes ESH should transfer a greater amount of funds to FESH and all payments should be made through FESH. K. Tsioufis suggested transferring 500,000 CHF. The Council unanimously accepted the transfer.

5. FUTURE MEETINGS

a. 2019 ESH Meeting, Milan – Overview

G. Mancia and M. Massaro summarized the progress of the 2019 Annual Meeting in Milan. A total of 16 Exhibitors have been confirmed. To save money, this year the meeting space (exhibition, posters area) will be concentrated on one floor.

A total of 961 abstracts have been received, and an estimated 100 late-breaker abstracts are expected. The major number of abstracts have been submitted by Russia, Italy and Greece.

- More involvement of young fellows

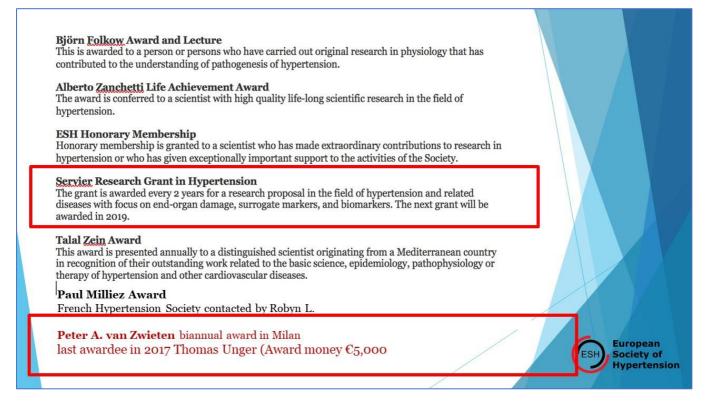
2019 Awards and ESH Honorary Members

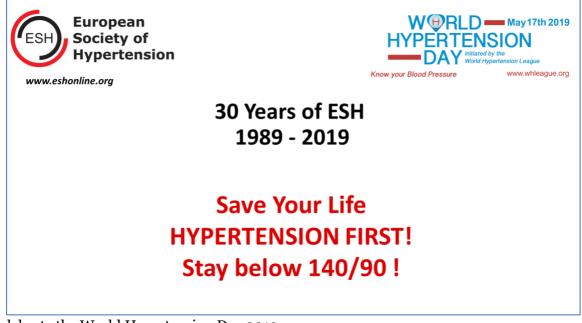
M. Massaro presented some ideas to celebrate the ESH Anniversary during the meeting in Milan:

- Memory Wall dedicated to the 30 Years of ESH in the Congress social area. Registered attendees will be invited to brig 1-2 photos/flyers/posters from past ESH activities.

- Photo Booth where attendees may have their photo taken marking their attendance during the 30 Years celebrations

- Parallel event open to public a patient-oriented activity where the public can have their BP measured and receive information aimed at providing better knowledge on hypertension and cardiovascular prevention. M. Massaro reported on the status of the joint ESH/ISH meeting in Glasgow. The venue "SEC" has been fixed, contract pending signature. Promotion of the meeting started in 2018 in Barcelona and during the ISH 2018 meeting in Beijing.

Key dates have been defined. K. Tsioufis pointed out that the abstract submission date, September 15, is too early. He proposed to establish a fixed date for abstract submissions for all annual meetings.

Glasgow City support has been confirmed. Major sponsors have also confirmed participation.

J. Polonia reported that following the letter sent to the National Societies inviting them to contact young physician members of their society, 75 young fellows replied. Of these 75, 26 are authors or co-authors of abstracts submitted for the Annual Meeting this year.

9. HYPERTENSION SUMMER SCHOOLS

- a. 2019 Athens (Greece) 14-20 September
 K. Tsioufis reported the programme for the 2019 Summer School has been finalized.
- b. 2020 Sremski Karlovci (Serbia) 12-18 September
 D. Lovice reported the programming for the 2020 Summer School is underway.

10. EXCELLENCE CENTRES

- a. Approval of new Excellence CentresB. Jelakovic informed the Council that 4 new Excellence Centres have been approved.
- b. Re-accreditation of Excellence CentresB. Jelakovic reported re-accreditation of 2 Excellence Centres.

11. WORKING GROUPS

- a. G. Parati reported the election of the new Chair and Vice-Chair of the WG on Hypertension and the Kidney.
- b. M. Burnier and R. Kreutz proposed to form a new WG on Drug Therapy and Adherence. It was suggested to find a time slot for the first meeting of the WG during meeting in Milan and circulate the invitation among the ESH members.

12. RULES FOR THE ENDORSEMENT OF THE PRE- AND POST-ESH SATELLITE SYMPOSIA AND INDUSTRY SUPPORTED SYMPOSIA

T. Kahan reported he is waiting for feedback from Amgen headquarters.

13. ESH RESEARCH PROJECTS

K. Tsioufis informed the Council a special session will be dedicated to the ESH Research Projects during the Satellite Symposium "Difficult to Control Hypertension & Related Comorbidities" to be held in March in Athens.

a. ESH BP Control Study

B. Jelakovic reported the BP Control Study started in October with the first group of 9 Excellence Centres. Delivery of the devices to the remaining Excellence Centres will begin shortly.

b. Working Group on Blood Pressure in Children and Adolescents

E. Lurbe reported on the activities carried out by the Working Group:

- 2016 ESH Guidelines in children and adolescents: Improving the knowledge of its implementation across Europe. A questionnaire was sent out to 38 National Hypertension Societies. The results of the Questionnaire can be considered excellent, with an answer rate of 60,5%.
- COST proposal: the submitted proposal received a score of 50. To receive funding a score of 56 is required. The proposal will be resubmitted.

14. POSITION PAPERS
